Tips for General Education Requirements:

- To graduate in 4 years, students must take an average of 15 hours per semester to earn the required 120 hours;
- Many majors require more hours per semester or summer classes;
- Of the 120 hours, you must take at least 40 upper level (300-400) hours;
- You must take at least 12 hours to be full time.
- You are required to declare a major by your Junior year.

Mathematics -- If you are considering any of the Business/Sociology/Psychology majors wait to take MTH-310. It will benefit you more if you do not take it your first year. It is ok to not take mathematics your first year. If you are completely undecided, it is better if you wait, so you take the correct mathematics course.

Philosophy/religion – Ethics courses will not fulfill this requirement, even though they have the prefix of REL or PHI.

Cross Cultural – If you are a considering majoring in ANY of the business areas you will be encouraged to take MGT-340 to fulfill this requirement, so you should wait.

Ethics – If you are considering ANY of the Business majors you should wait to take MGT/MKT-424 to fulfill this requirement, which will fulfill the general education requirement as well.

If you are considering majoring in Environmental Studies, you should wait to take this requirement or take PHI-208 as it is a requirement for the major and will fulfill the general education requirement.

If you are considering a computer science major, you should wait to take CSI-369, which will fulfill the general education requirement as well.

If you are considering Education:

History – you must take a United States History course or wait until you decide upon a major.

Computer Science – you will be required to take EDU-115 instead of CSI-120, but should wait until you take EDU-210 to do this.
